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OVERVIEW/SUMMARY

The RHS Housing Advisory Committee met Wednesday, April 26th, at the Lussier Family Heritage Center, to learn more about different strategies at the local level that could potentially be included within the Regional Strategic Action Plan. The goal was to provide a baseline understanding of the various tools available and the current use of those tools across the County. HAC members then strategized and prioritized affordable and workforce housing solutions using custom-made information cards, voting with jars and pom poms in an open-house style format. HAC members who couldn't attend or didn't finish at the meeting were invited to conduct the same exercise using SurveyMonkey. Based off of the feedback received, the HAC will explore regional/national best practices to help fill in any gaps. The HAC continues to progress toward a shortlist of measurable, achievable strategies that can be implemented over the next 3-5 years throughout Dane County.

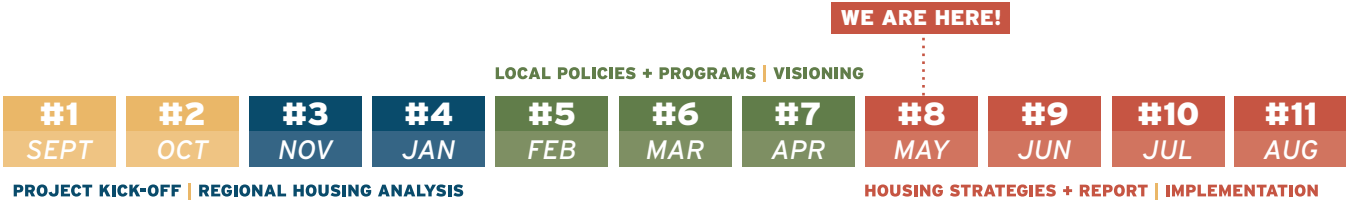

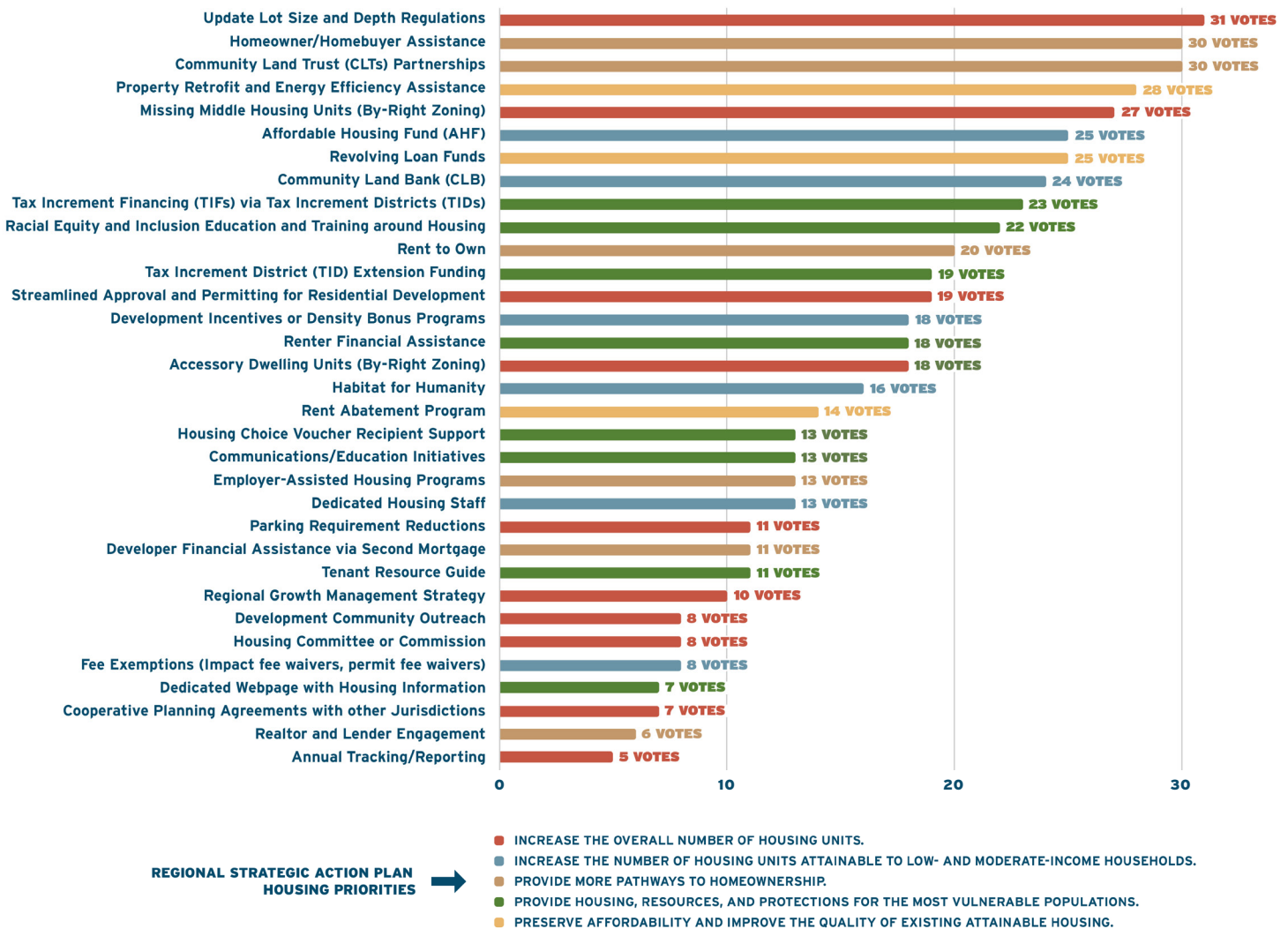
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HAC DRAFT STRATEGIES FEEDBACK

HAC members walked around the room and visited five (5) different tables, each representing an established Housing Priority built off of the group's refinement from HAC Meeting #6. Each table included jars labeled with potential strategies that most align with that priority. HAC members moved at their own pace among tables, reading about each strategy and placing a pom pom in the strategy jar that they felt was most essential for the Regional Strategic Action Plan. Included below are the overall scores of each strategy across all housing priorities.

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ADDITIONAL STRATEGIES

HAC members also provided feedback on specific strategies and identified gaps in strategies for each housing priority.

- *Create Home Repair Grants.*
- *Support the mandating of attorneys in eviction court and ensure bilingual attorneys are present.*
- *Reduce costs to bring Madison Area Community Land Trust (MACLT) into communities.*
- *Build better support systems around Co-Ops, cohabitating, and shared housing.*
- *Create a retaliation ordinance program to support a rent abatement program.*
